## Understanding Early Literacy for School Leaders

School leaders will gain 1) an understanding of early literacy development, 2) tools to communicate best practices to stakeholders - including families, and 3) structures to facilitate a professional learning community around central concepts in literacy development. Topics will include knowledge of development for reading, writing, and language broadly, tools to teach readers to support their meaning making processes at unknowns, and an overview of frameworks and approaches to teaching reading development. Leaders will leave with slides and talking points for facilitating conversations about literacy growth as well as a list of resources that can support their own and their team's development in early literacy instruction.
