Local Offerings at AISGW Schools

AISAP Annual Institute for Admission Professionals

National Offerings with an Independent School Focus

ATLIS Leadership Institute

June 24-27, Columbus, OH

The ATLIS Leadership Institute is an education and networking program designed to prepare and support technology leaders in independent schools as they grow into their positions and expand their influence. From summer 2025 through spring 2026, the program consists of a three-day in-person kickoff event, monthly online meetings via Zoom and an in-person graduation next year at the ATLIS Annual Conference in Columbus, OH.

Carney Sandoe & Associates Summer Leadership Institutes

• *gcLI Leadership Lab* (for K-12 teachers)

June 16-22, Colorado Springs, CO

Through an array of top-tier professional development programs, the *gcLi* teaches teachers to take advantage of the opportunities every day when leadership can be taught. Built on compelling research in brain science, developmental psychology, social-emotional learning, group dynamics, leadership studies, and more, the *gcLi* helps K-12 teachers develop in their students the capacity, the desire, and the will to lead.

After the retreat is complete, participants in The Well will continue to benefit from the institute's community through seasonal check-ins with guided support from expert coaches and practitioners.

• <u>The Women's Institute</u>

Launched in 2017, the goal of the Women's Institute is to contribute to the overall development and empowerment of women* in all stages of their professional journeys, whether that's serving as a teacher, head of school, friend, mentor, or classroom leader, and to provide a safe space for women* and their allies to discuss challenges and triumphs in the workplace and in life.

Center for Spiritual and Ethical Education (CSEE)

• <u>Adult Ethics Institute</u>

July 7-10, New York, NY

In the midst of the school year there is hardly the time to catch a breath and much less the opportunity to sit with challenging literature and discuss nuanced twists to stories that make for ethically rich discernment. This multi-day Ethics Institute is designed to provide this very time and context. In advance of the workshop, participants will be asked to read three selected books,

all related to independent school experiences, and write an ethical case study to share (guidelines will be provided). This advance work provides the fodder for intensive conversation and collegial support as the group explores a variety of ethical challenges. A combination of exploring the principles of ethics, engaging in intellectually stimulating book discussions, and discussing real-life case studies frame out the week as participants learn from each other and deepen their understanding of how ethics guide our actions and decision making.

Institute for Teaching World Religions

July 7-10, New York, NY

Knowledge of the world's religious traditions is vitally important for communication and understanding in our current world. CSEE's institute brings together religious studies scholars and world religion teachers for thought-provoking presentations, activity sharing, and camaraderie. Participants will leave with new knowledge, new ideas for the classroom, helpful resources, and enduring contacts. Sessions will also include ways to incorporate the learned material into the classroom setting.

• <u>Stanley H. King Summer Institutes</u>

June 23-27, Pottersville, NJ; July 28-August 1, Colorado Springs, CO

Stanley H. King Institute offers training in deep listening skills for teachers, advisors, administrators, and other non-clinical, student-facing school personnel. Our goal is not to train professional counselors, but to help teachers strengthen and deepen their relationships with students. Participants learn to help students with the range of developmental issues, as well as to recognize serious psychological difficulty and seek appropriate help. For more than fifty years, teachers from independent schools across the United States and beyond have gathered for intensive, week-long residential workshops led by experienced mental health and counseling professionals familiar with the independent school world to learn how to *listen in a new way*.

<u>Chesapeake Bay Foundation Environmental Leadership for Independent School Leaders</u> July 23-25, Tangier, VA

Individuals in independent school sustainability leadership roles across the watershed are invited to join the Chesapeake Bay Foundation for a three-day immersive exploration of the Bay and the unique waterman community of Tangier Island. CBF is partnering with AIMS, AISGW, VAIS, The Gunston School and The Country School to offer a course specifically tailored to independent school environmental sustainability leaders. Through hands-on experiences, course participants will consider how a school's "environmental mission statement" impacts school culture; explore how organizational structures can support and enhance a school's environmental mission; and how a school can most effectively design and implement high-impact environmental curriculum and programming to benefit their local environment, promote environmental literacy, and boost academic achievement. In addition, participants will learn how a school's campus and facilities can serve as an integrating context for environmental teaching and learning while boosting student mental health and well-being.

EE Ford Summer Teachers' Colloquium

Everyone loves the summer. It is a time for rest and relaxation, and that educators need in order to replenish the emotional resources required for teaching well.
