Local AISGW School Offerings

<u>Georgetown Day School and National Network of Schools in Partnership - Degrees of</u> <u>Impact</u>

July 17-18, 2023, Washington, D.C.

Join us for a two-day working session that will provide educators from across the country the opportunity to connect and consider emerging practices and trends for community engagement, civic, and partnership programs. Examine frameworks and guidelines while using tools developed by the National Network of Schools in Partnership to repurpose and strengthen your community engagement, social impact, and partnership programs. Attendees will be introduced to a variety of ways that community and civic engagement programs are integrated into a PK-12 curriculum as well as they will be given ample time to design or redesign their own programs through a design thinking process. Transforming Teaching Summer Collaborative

July 19th-20th, Newtown Square, PA

TTSC is a unique opportunity for leaders of teaching and learning to come together in order to think deeply about the year ahead of them and plan proactively to lead instruction and guide change in their schools. The Collaborative is different than other conferences or retreats because it focuses on the needs of the attendees and is designed to maximize the power of collaboration. Our goal is to provide each attendee with a retreat for their professional mind - a place to come to be inspired, share stories of what works in schools, and leave feeling a renewed sense of purpose and energy for the year to come.

World Leadership School: Educator Travel to Belize

June 24th-July 1st

During the beginning of the program, we will travel to Belize's mountainous region to explore the natural environment and connect with a local elementary school. Mornings will be spent hiking to the ancient Mayan ruins of Xunantunich and exploring the Actun Tunichil Muknal (ATM) cave, where we will experience an ancient Mayan sacrificial site with skulls, pots, and ceremonial altars virtually untouched for centuries. We will spend our afternoons at a local school and work in collaboration with local teachers on curriculum exchange and development. During this time, we will explore WLS' Purpose Learning Frameworks. For the last few days, we will head to Belize's coast and hop aboard a motor boat for Tobacco Caye, a sandy island located directly on Belize's barrier reef system. We will stay in beachside bungalows that provide easy access to snorkeling throughout the day, exploring local mangrove forests, and enjoying the gorgeous island scenery. We will also visit the Smithsonian Tropical Research Institute research station on nearby Carrie Bow Cay. On our final day, we will travel by motorboat to the coastal town of Dangriga. From here we will catch a charter bus to Belize City for our final evening before our return flight to the U.S. Our meals, which are prepared on-site at each location, are healthy and delicious. Meals emphasize local foods such as plantains, rice, beans, and native fruits and vegetables. While on the islands, we will eat fish and other seafood.

<u>World Leadership School: Rafting Program for School Heads</u> July 13th-18th

Now in its second year, this unique program for heads on Idaho's iconic Salmon River creates a deep space for heads to build community, gather energy for the year ahead, and explore game-changing ideas. Each morning on the river, after a delicious breakfast, we explore critical questions in small groups. We then board rafts and duckies as we explore Class III rapids on the "River of No Return." Afternoons are for fly fishing and hiking and evenings are for delicious dinners and campfire discussion. We will meet five times virtually during the 2023-24 school year to create a "peer coaching" space that deepens our relationships and learning. This is a challenging year-long learning program that is designed for personal and professional renewal and growth.

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
